We are working with Ceres School District “Project Yes” and Stanislaus County “Alliance Work Net Career Quest Youth Program”. We are excited at having our first student to come through the training program starting in August and more to follow in September. Come check us out and have a delicious breakfast or lunch. The café is located at 2413 3rd Street in Hughson. It is open for breakfast and lunch seven days a week. Monday thru Friday the hours are 6 am to 2 pm. Saturday and Sundays it is open 7am to 2 pm. 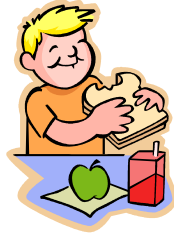

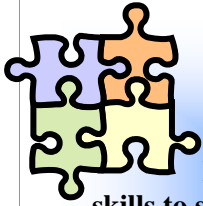
