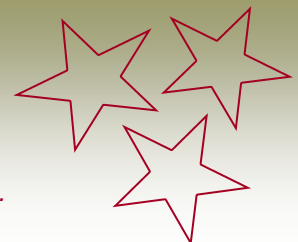
Meet our Hughson Staff, Jackie Popio and Raymond Rogers. Our kitchen in Hughson is located in the USF Complex at 2413 Third Street. The lunches prepared at this site are delivered on our mobile food truck to the communities of Hughson, Empire, Waterford, Hickman and Denair. With the help of volunteers we serve an average of 7,000 lunches a month. At this site we also operate a Clothes Closet and an Emergency Food Box Program for Hughson residents. At USF Hughson Complex we house the Hughson Public Library,

Hughson Family Medical Clinic, and the Hughson Pharmacy. The USF Community Center is home to the Hughson Family Resource, Stanislaus County Community Service Agency and the Daily Bread Café operated by Sierra Vista Children and Family Services for a training program.

We are the largest non-profit direct food distributor to the hungry within Stanislaus County, serving over 35,000 meals a month.
